

Bar Association Dues C NJSBA Waiver of Section dues by New Jersey State Bar Association

By letter of May 10, 1989, Gerald M. Eisenstat, President of the New Jersey State Bar Association, advised judges who are NJSBA members that the Association's Board of Trustees had agreed to waive section dues for judges for 1989-90. Subsequently, an inquiry was raised as to whether judges could accept the proffered waiver.

The Supreme Court, at its Administrative Conference on September 11, 1989, determined that it would be improper for judges to accept the waiver of dues since it constitutes a gift not available to other NJSBA members.

Kindly advise the judges in your respective vicinages of the Court's determination in this matter. In the event that some judges inadvertently accepted the waiver, would you also advise them to make arrangements for paying the dues for the sections in which they are enrolled.
