ORDER SETTING AMENDED
DISCOVERY SCHEDULE

THIS MATTER, having been assigned to the Honorable Rachelle L. Harz, J.S.C. pursuant to the Supreme Court's Order of July 22, 2016 ordering centralized case management of the New Jersey state court actions arising out of the use of the oral contraceptives Yaz®, Yasmin® and Ocella®, and the parties hereby requesting that the Court amend the discovery schedule set by the Court's June 14, 2016 Order and enter the following discovery schedule;

And for good cause shown, the following Order is hereby entered:

IT IS SO ORDERED on this 10 day of February, 2017,

1. Case-specific fact discovery shall conclude on or before February 28, 2017. Parties must identify any witness they intend to depose no later than 30 days before the conclusion of case-specific fact discovery.
2. Plaintiffs' additional case-specific expert reports under R. 4:10-2(d) and R. 4:17-4(e), if any, shall be served no later than 30 days after the conclusion of case-specific fact discovery.


3. Defendants' additional case-specific expert reports under R. 4:10-2(d) and R. 4:17-4(e), if any, shall be served no later than 30 days after the deadline for plaintiffs' case-specific expert reports.

4. Expert depositions, to the extent either party seeks this discovery, shall be taken following receipt of all expert reports and shall conclude 30 days after the deadline for defendants' expert reports.

5. *Kemp* motions and dispositive motions, if any, shall be filed no later than 14 days after the conclusion of expert discovery, with response briefs due 30 days later.

6. Any party may ask the Court to modify any of the above deadlines, either to extend or shorten them, following a meet and confer with the other party.

7. No discovery shall be permitted except as specifically contemplated in the above schedule without prior leave of the Court.
