Report on the Prevention of Domestic Violence Act

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Introduction

This domestic violence statistical report, prepared by the New Jersey Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC), provides statistics compiled by the Judiciary on domestic violence matters brought before the New Jersey courts pursuant to the Prevention of Domestic Violence Act, N.J.S.A. 2C:25-17 et seq. (PDVA).

This report presents data, covering the period from Jan. 1, 2018 through Dec. 31, 2020, regarding domestic violence filings, dispositions of restraining orders, and forms of relief sought and granted. New data elements have been added to this report including:

- Number of granted reliefs for weapons seizures on temporary restraining orders (TROs).
- The average length of time for the defendant to be served.
- The number of cases where child support has been ordered either under the FV (domestic violence) docket or under a companion FD (non-dissolution) or FM (dissolution) docket.
- The number of times certain reliefs were sought and granted on final restraining orders (FROs).
- Information regarding the use of the Ontario Domestic Assault Risk Assessment (ODARA) when a criminal complaint is filed that also has a domestic violence (DV) indicator.

Additionally, this report includes data from the municipal and criminal divisions regarding criminal cases that have been identified as related to a domestic violence incident and data on non-indictable contempt charges, which are processed in family court pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9(b).

Prevention of Domestic Violence Act of 1991

New Jersey's PDVA is one of the strongest laws in the nation addressing domestic violence. The PDVA provides the following:

- Domestic violence definitions, including the 19 offenses from which a person is protected under this act.
- Domestic violence training requirements for judges, law enforcement and court staff.
- Guidance to law enforcement regarding the following:
 - the arrest of the alleged attacker,
 - the seizure of weapons, and
 - the filing of a criminal charge or a civil temporary restraining order (TRO).
- Requirements and process if a criminal domestic violence charge is filed against the defendant, including sentencing conditions, if found guilty.
- Requirements and process for filing a civil complaint alleging domestic violence in the Superior Court, family part.
- Penalties or fees to be assessed against the defendant.
- The contempt process that is applied when a defendant has violated a court order.
- The confidentiality of domestic violence records.
- Requirement for New Jersey to maintain a central registry of all persons who have a
 domestic violence restraining order entered against them.

Legal Process

Civil Procedure

Procedurally, the PDVA provides that a single domestic violence incident may give rise to both civil and/or criminal remedies. In the civil process, a domestic violence civil complaint is an application for a TRO. A victim may apply for a TRO in either the Superior Court or municipal court. If a civil TRO is granted, a subsequent hearing is usually held within 10 days to determine whether the TRO will become a final restraining order (FRO).

FROs include two primary types of relief to the victim: injunctive relief, and non-injunctive relief. Injunctive relief directs the defendant's action, i.e., to have no contact with the victim, and/or to stay away from certain locations. Non-injunctive relief may include imposing financial penalties and obligations, the relinquishment of property and/or possessions, child support, and emergency monetary relief. The purpose of non-injunctive relief is to permit the victim support without the need to return to the abusive relationship, N.J.S.A. 2C:25-29b(10).

Criminal Procedure

A criminal complaint involving domestic violence addresses criminal charges. Law enforcement must arrest the defendant and sign a criminal complaint if they find probable cause that domestic violence occurred along with certain other conditions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:25-21.

Violations

Contempt charges are how TROs and FROs are enforced. When a defendant violates the provisions of a restraining order, a contempt charge is filed by law enforcement or the victim. An example of a violation is when a defendant contacts a victim either in person, by telephone or by electronic media when the restraining order specifically states that the defendant is to have no contact with the victim. Violations of a restraining order may result in civil contempt proceedings and/or criminal charges.

The degree of the contempt charge determines whether the family or criminal division will hear the case. The family division has exclusive jurisdiction if the violation involves a petty disorderly persons offense, disorderly persons offense or if the violation involves actions related to child support or parenting time provisions in the order. The criminal division hears contempt charges if the defendant committed a violation that constitutes an indictable offense. A prosecutor is involved in all criminal contempt charges regardless of whether the case is heard in either the family or criminal division.

Stop Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant

The United States Department of Justice provides grant funding to the states to fight violent crimes against women as well as create and strengthen victim services. The Judiciary used this grant to provide the annual statewide Domestic Violence Conferences that are held each spring for all family division judges, managers, and domestic violence staff.

Conference topics in 2018 included sessions on:

- cultural awareness,
- situational couple violence,

- stalking,
- · teen dating,
- animal cruelty,
- · cyber violence, and
- strangulation.

Conference topics in 2019 included sessions on:

- intersection of human trafficking and the opioid crisis,
- restraining orders and the other family matters,
- trauma informed courts,
- batterers intervention programs,
- co-occurrence of sexual abuse and domestic violence,
- understanding risk in domestic violence,
- assessing legal credibility in the context of trauma and
- children services policies and protocols in relation to domestic violence.

Conference topics in 2020 included virtual sessions on:

- digital impersonation and deep-fakes,
- SOGI issues in family division context: an interactive workshop on LGBTQ+ inclusive practices,
- human trafficking,
- batterer myths and biases; and
- elder abuse.

Additionally, with VAWA funding, the AOC's family practice division was able to collaborate with Rutgers University to provide vicinage domestic violence staff with the Violence Against Woman and Children Professional Training Program (VAWAC-PT). VAWAC-PT is a unique and engaging program that provides professionals with the knowledge and the practical skills needed to understand and effectively address the myriad issues faced by people who are victims of violence. Class topics included the following: Understanding Violence Against Women; Understanding Perpetration of Violence Against Women; Violence Against Women in Middle & High School Populations; Impact of Domestic Violence on Children; Violence Against Women in College Populations; Screening, Assessment and Basic Interventions; Violence Against Women in Diverse Populations; Legal Responses to Violence Against Women; Violence Against Women and Technology; and Ethical Issues & Values in Violence Against Women Work.

Staff who complete the full complement of courses receive a domestic violence certification from Rutgers University.

In 2019, in addition to the above training, funds were used to provide Domestic Violence 101 training. The training was provided to DV staff in the 15 vicinages with the assistance of the New Jersey Coalition to End Domestic Violence. The classes were comprised of the following domestic violence topics:

- basics,
- dynamics,
- trauma, and
- statistics.

In 2020, Rutgers University presented a master domestic violence class to staff who had previously received the VAWAC-PT certificate. Topics included the following:

- Mental Health and Domestic Violence
- Economic Empowerment and Domestic Violence
- Substance Abuse and Domestic Violence

Electronic System Enhancements

eTRO and FACTS

The Judiciary employs several electronic systems to track, docket, and process domestic violence restraining orders. The Electronic Temporary Restraining Order (eTRO) system is the electronic data entry program that is used by law enforcement and family court staff to create electronic civil domestic violence complaints, TROs and FROs. The Family Automated Case Tracking System (FACTS) is the mainframe program that houses the official electronic court records. The Domestic Violence Central Registry (DVCR) is a registry of all persons who have a domestic violence restraining order entered against them. Technical enhancements are made annually to the eTRO system to assist staff and judges in processing cases more efficiently.

In 2019, enhancements were made to the eTRO system to allow processing for the new immediate de novo requests. Prior to implementation of this directive, victims of domestic violence would make an application for a TRO with law enforcement when the Superior Court was closed. However, if the victim requested a de novo review of the denied TRO, the victim had to wait until the Superior Court was open for business. The safety of a domestic violence victim is always of utmost concern, and during a weekend or holiday, a victim may have had to wait two to three days for a de novo hearing.

Pursuant to the directive, if the victim requests a de novo review at the time the municipal court denies their request for a TRO, law enforcement will immediately contact an on-call Superior Court judge who will review the victim's original complaint. The Superior Court judge will conduct a hearing remotely and either grant or deny the TRO.

In 2020, in addition to the annual enhancements and upgrades, cover pages were added to the TROs providing COVID-19 court-related information to the plaintiff and defendant. Furthermore, criminal no-contact orders were added into the Domestic Violence Central Registry (DVCR) which are now viewable to law enforcement personnel.

2018 Judiciary Initiatives for Domestic Violence

Self-Help packet on "How to Enforce or Request a Change of a Domestic Violence Restraining Order or Sexual Assault Survivor Protection Order"

A new domestic violence self-help packet and instructions has been promulgated by the Judiciary. The packet is to be used when a litigant seeks to enforce or modify a domestic violence restraining order or sexual assault protection order under the family violence (FV) docket. The new self-help packet is available on the Domestic Violence and SASPA (Sexual Assault Survivor's Protection Act) forms page of the Judiciary's Internet webpage. Furthermore, criminal no-contact orders were added into the Domestic Violence Central Registry (DVCR), which are now viewable to law enforcement staff.

Translation of Domestic Violence complaint, Temporary Restraining Order and Final Restraining Order

To assist litigants whose first language is not English, the Judiciary has now translated the New Jersey Domestic Violence Civil Complaint, Temporary Restraining Order and Final Restraining Order templates into Spanish, Haitian Creole, Portuguese, Korean and Polish for interpreting services only. These templates are not the official orders.

Order of Disposition - Domestic Violence Contempt Proceedings

A standard Order of Disposition for use in a contempt proceeding based on a violation of a domestic violence restraining order was promulgated by the Judiciary in 2018. This new order contains areas to record dispositions and impose financial penalties. In addition, the order contains check boxes that address requirements specified by the following two recently enacted statutes:

- N.J.S.A. 53:1-20.17, effective July 1, 2017, which requires defendants convicted of specified disorderly persons offenses to submit a DNA sample; and
- N.J.S.A. 2C:25-27(c)(1), effective Aug. 1, 2017, which prohibits defendants found guilty of a crime or offense involving domestic violence, from purchasing, owning, possessing, or controlling a firearm and from receiving or retaining a firearms purchaser identification card or permit to purchase a handgun.

Directive #14-18 - Revised Domestic Violence Hearing Officer Program Standards

Directive #14-18, Domestic Violence Hearing Officer Program Standards, was issued superseding Directive #25-17. The revised directive allows domestic violence hearing officers at the discretion of the presiding judge to recommend a continuance order at the final hearing when only one party appears on the final hearing date and there are no amendments to the TRO.

2019 Judiciary Initiatives for Domestic Violence

Directive #13-19 - Immediate DeNovo Hearing for the Municipal Court of a Denial of a Domestic Violence Temporary Restraining Order
Directive #13-19, Immediate De Novo Hearing for the Municipal Court Denial of a Domestic Violence Temporary Restraining Order, was promulgated in July 2019.

New Jersey Bench Guide of Domestic Violence Risk Factors

This guide was created to assist judges and hearing officers in identifying domestic violence risk factors that may be indicative of escalating and potentially fatal domestic violence. The guide may also be valuable in assisting courts in crafting temporary and final restraining orders, specifically regarding custody, parental cases, parenting time, and program mandates. This document is not exhaustive, is not meant to be a substitute for the court's discretion in determining the credibility of the allegations and weight for each factor, and is not meant to be filled out, scored in any way, or placed in the court file.

Directive #19-19 Guidelines for Extreme Risk Protective Orders

Directive #19-19 promulgated Guidelines for Extreme Risk Protective Orders. The guidelines establish a civil process and procedures for a petitioner to seek an extreme risk protective order. This protective order specifically prohibits a person from owning, purchasing, possessing, or receiving firearms or ammunition, or from securing or holding a firearms purchaser identification card, a permit to purchase a handgun pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:58-3, or a permit to carry a handgun pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:58-4.

There are four ways a civil petition for a temporary extreme risk protective order can be filed:

- A family or household member can file a petition at the criminal division of the Superior Court.
- 2. A law enforcement officer petitioner may file with the court.
- 3. Other persons who are neither family or household members nor law enforcement officers may request at a law enforcement agency that a law enforcement officer file a petition with the court.
- 4. A petition against a law enforcement officer, which must be filed at the law enforcement agency where the respondent is employed.

However, these orders do not offer the range of relief provided by restraining orders issued pursuant to the "Prevention of Domestic Violence Act of 1991."

2020 Judiciary Initiatives for Domestic Violence

In 2020, while globally and nationally many businesses closed and operations paused due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the New Jersey Judiciary realized that it needed to remain available to the public but would have to develop new ways to provide needed services. The Judiciary continued to operate, and the use of technology rose to the forefront as hearings became virtual either by video or telephone and filings became electronic by submission through the new Judiciary Electronic Document Submission (JEDS) system. While the use of technology increased exponentially, the Judiciary understood that not all New Jersey residents have the technical knowledge or access to equipment to connect electronically to the court. With the aid of the Judiciary Ombudsman Program, which can respond to questions in every county, and the availability of technology rooms for use by litigants, the Judiciary provides assistance and services to court users who may not have the ability to connect to the Judiciary remotely.

Directive #06-20 - Domestic Violence Economic Mediation Program-Operational Guidelines and Forms

This directive promulgates statewide operational guidelines for the Domestic Violence Economic Mediation (DVEM) program. The DVEM program enables litigants to mediate economic issues in dissolution matters where there is an active domestic violence final restraining order between the parties. The mediation is to only address economic issues, not custody or parenting time. This program has been temporarily paused due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The program will resume once the courthouses are sufficiently staffed to near or full capacity.

Directive #17-20 - Co-occurring Orders Involving No-Contact Release Conditions and Domestic Violence or Custody Matters

This directive promulgates the process to ensure communication between divisions where a defendant has a no-contact order in the criminal division and a concurrent domestic violence or custody matter in the family division.

Directive #19-20 - Domestic Violence Temporary Orders – Procedures for Taking Applications Remotely

This directive promulgates the process in which a litigant can contact the family division remotely during normal court hours to request a temporary restraining order.

Directive #25-20 - Application to Amend Domestic Violence Complaint and Instruction Packet

This directive promulgates a domestic violence form and instruction packet for victims who have already been granted a temporary restraining order to administratively amend their domestic violence complaint for certain reasons. The reasons to amend the domestic violence complaint without having to come to the courthouse are as follows:

- To add additional verbiage about the predicate offense that was not captured on the original complaint.
- To indicate if the defendant violated the restraining order and/or to capture additional predicate acts that were not designated on the original complaint.
- To add additional prior domestic violence history that was not captured on the original complaint. and;
- To add any children who were not referenced in the original complaint.

Domestic Violence Statistical Data

This report presents data regarding domestic violence filings, dispositions of restraining orders, and forms of relief sought and granted. Additionally, this report includes data from the municipal and criminal divisions regarding criminal cases that have been identified as related to a domestic violence incident and data on non-indictable contempt charges, which are processed in family court pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9(b).

ODARA Completions on a Criminal Complaint with a DV Indicator Pursuant to the Attorney General 2016-6 v3.0 directive, the director of the Division of Criminal Justice designated the ODARA as the risk assessment tool to be used by law enforcement officers throughout New Jersey to assist in identifying the risk of future assaults against intimate partners. The ODARA predicts the likelihood that a defendant who has committed assault on an intimate partner will do so again. The risk assessment tool is administered by a trained law enforcement officer through an interview with the victim. The law enforcement officer will also conduct a review of the defendant's criminal history and



Domestic Violence Complaints

As set forth below and in detail in the following pages, the number of domestic violence filings remains relatively static each year except in the year 2020. For several months in 2020, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, local law enforcement and municipal courts were responsible for completing the TRO complaints and conducting the TRO proceedings. Therefore, as noted in Chart A, the municipal origination of domestic violence complaints increased significantly in 2020 as compared to the years prior to the pandemic.


Chart A

Gender

The data illustrated in Chart B below depicts that in New Jersey, more than 76 pecent of the plaintiffs are women. However, men can be and are victims, too. Men, in addition to women, suffer physical, mental, and sexual abuse in both heterosexual and same-sex relationships.






Children and Domestic Violence

Children exposed to violence in the home are also victims of physical abuse.¹ Children who witness domestic violence or are victims of abuse themselves are at serious risk for long-term physical and mental health problems.² Children who witness violence between parents may also be at greater risk of being violent in their future relationships. As depicted in Chart C below, although a majority of the parties in domestic violence complaints did not have children in common, there are a significant number of cases with children that may have been impacted by violence in the home.







Dispositions

As represented in the Chart D below, the disposition of TROs has been consistent for several years. On average, more than 5,000 FROs are entered by the Superior Court annually. In 2020, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there was also an increase in the number of extended TROs due to lack of service of the TRO to the defendant.

Dispositions




Violations

If the defendant violates a domestic violence restraining order, that violation constitutes the offense of "contempt" under N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9 (b).

The degree of the contempt charge determines whether the family or criminal division will hear the case. The family division has exclusive jurisdiction if the violation involves a petty disorderly persons offense, disorderly persons offense or if the violation involves actions related to child support or parenting time provisions in the order. The criminal division hears contempt charges if the defendant committed a violation that constitutes an indictable offense. A prosecutor is involved in all criminal contempt charges regardless of whether the case is heard in the family or criminal division.

As depicted in Chart E the continued collection and analysis of New Jersey's domestic violence data assists in the creation or modification of judicial policies and procedures. This data will continue to be reviewed by the Judiciary to assist in effectuating the intent of the Prevention of Domestic Violence Act to provide New Jersey domestic violence victims with maximum protection from domestic abuse.

Violations of Restraining Orders - Filings and Dispositions Statewide Figures

Enforcement of Domestic Violence Temporary Restraining Orders (TROs) or Final Restraining Orders (FROs) can be pursued either through the criminal contempt process, N.J.S.A.2C:29-9b or N.J.S.A.2C:25-30, or the civil enforcement of litigant's rights process under R.1:10-3. Under the criminal statute, violations of any restraints and certain reliefs and conditions of a restraining order require mandatory arrest and criminal prosecution. Violations of other reliefs and conditions are enforceable by the court pursuant to applicable court rules. The Family Division has jurisdiction over disorderly person's domestic violence contempt actions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9b. This includes contempt charges that were initially indictable but have been downgraded by the Prosecutor's Office in the county of venue. The following section reports the data on those cases. It does not cover indictable contempts of the fourth degree and above, which are handled in the Criminal Division.

Section Five Criminal Domestic Violence Cases - Filings and Dispositions Statewide Figures

A criminal case is identified as involving domestic violence when there is a charge of contempt for violating a domestic violence restraining order (N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9b) or the case has been flagged by the Prosecutor as a domestic violence matter. Filings include initial complaints, direct indictments and direct accusations. Indictments resulting from complaints are counted as a filing when they first enter the system as initial complaints.

A disposition is the final resolution of a case. Pre-Trial Intervention (PTI) admissions are also included in these statistics. The category 'Transfer to Family' are those contempt cases that were initially identified as indictable, but have been downgraded to disorderly person's domestic violence contempt cases by the Prosecutor's Office in the county of venue. The Family Division has jurisdiction over disorderly person's (DP) contempt actions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-2b. The category 'Transfer to Other' are those cases transferred to another jurisdiction, transferred to the Attorney General or sent to Casino Prosecution.

The number of filings and dispositions are based on the FILING date and DISPOSITION date, respectively, and are independent of one another for the time period listed.

The following tables provide information regarding the number of domestic violence complaints processed by the municipal courts. A complaint, which may include more than one charge, is designated a domestic violence complaint if at least one charge constitutes a domestic violence offense under N.J.S.A. 2C:25-19a.

For the present analysis, a 'filed' domestic violence complaint is one that falls within the initial jurisdiction of the municipal court. This includes most domestic violence related disorderly persons and petty disorderly persons offenses. Domestic violence complaints that include indictable and other charges that statutorily fall within the jurisdiction of the Superior Court, even if filed in municipal court, are not counted. Those filings are properly reflected in the criminal section of this report.

The disposition information includes all domestic violence complaints adjudicated by a municipal court. This includes all cases falling within the initial jurisdiction of a municipal court as well as cases downgraded and remanded back to municipal court by the County Prosecutor.

The number of filings and dispositions are based on the FILING date and DISPOSITION date, respectively, and are independent of one another for the time period listed.

Section Four

Violations of Restraining Orders - Filings and Dispositions Statewide Figures

Enforcement of Domestic Violence Temporary Restraining Orders (TROs) or Final Restraining Orders (FROs) can be pursued either through the criminal contempt process, N.J.S.A.2C:29-9b or N.J.S.A.2C:25-30, or the civil enforcement of litigant's rights process under R.1:10-3. Under the criminal statute, violations of any restraints and certain reliefs and conditions of a restraining order require mandatory arrest and criminal prosecution. Violations of other reliefs and conditions are enforceable by the court pursuant to applicable court rules. The Family Division has jurisdiction over disorderly person's domestic violence contempt actions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9b. This includes contempt charges that were initially indictable but have been downgraded by the Prosecutor's Office in the county of venue. The following section reports the data on those cases. It does not cover indictable contempts of the fourth degree and above, which are handled in the Criminal Division.

Section Five Criminal Domestic Violence Cases - Filings and Dispositions Statewide Figures

A criminal case is identified as involving domestic violence when there is a charge of contempt for violating a domestic violence restraining order (N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9b) or the case has been flagged by the Prosecutor as a domestic violence matter. Filings include initial complaints, direct indictments and direct accusations. Indictments resulting from complaints are counted as a filing when they first enter the system as initial complaints.

A disposition is the final resolution of a case. Pre-Trial Intervention (PTI) admissions are also included in these statistics. The category 'Transfer to Family' are those contempt cases that were initially identified as indictable, but have been downgraded to disorderly person's domestic violence contempt cases by the Prosecutor's Office in the county of venue. The Family Division has jurisdiction over disorderly person's (DP) contempt actions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-2b. The category 'Transfer to Other' are those cases transferred to another jurisdiction, transferred to the Attorney General or sent to Casino Prosecution.

The number of filings and dispositions are based on the FILING date and DISPOSITION date, respectively, and are independent of one another for the time period listed.

The following tables provide information regarding the number of domestic violence complaints processed by the municipal courts. A complaint, which may include more than one charge, is designated a domestic violence complaint if at least one charge constitutes a domestic violence offense under N.J.S.A. 2C:25-19a.

For the present analysis, a 'filed' domestic violence complaint is one that falls within the initial jurisdiction of the municipal court. This includes most domestic violence related disorderly persons and petty disorderly persons offenses. Domestic violence complaints that include indictable and other charges that statutorily fall within the jurisdiction of the Superior Court, even if filed in municipal court, are not counted. Those filings are properly reflected in the criminal section of this report.

The disposition information includes all domestic violence complaints adjudicated by a municipal court. This includes all cases falling within the initial jurisdiction of a municipal court as well as cases downgraded and remanded back to municipal court by the County Prosecutor.

The number of filings and dispositions are based on the FILING date and DISPOSITION date, respectively, and are independent of one another for the time period listed.

Section Four

Violations of Restraining Orders - Filings and Dispositions Statewide Figures

Enforcement of Domestic Violence Temporary Restraining Orders (TROs) or Final Restraining Orders (FROs) can be pursued either through the criminal contempt process, N.J.S.A.2C:29-9b or N.J.S.A.2C:25-30, or the civil enforcement of litigant's rights process under R.1:10-3. Under the criminal statute, violations of any restraints and certain reliefs and conditions of a restraining order require mandatory arrest and criminal prosecution. Violations of other reliefs and conditions are enforceable by the court pursuant to applicable court rules. The Family Division has jurisdiction over disorderly person's domestic violence contempt actions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9b. It does not cover indictable contempts of the fourth degree and above, which are handled in the Criminal Division.

Section Five Criminal Domestic Violence Cases - Filings and Dispositions Statewide Figures

A criminal case is identified as involving domestic violence when there is a charge of contempt for violating a domestic violence restraining order (N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9b) or the case has been flagged by the Prosecutor as a domestic violence matter. Filings include initial complaints, direct indictments and direct accusations. Indictments resulting from complaints are counted as a filing when they first enter the system as initial complaints.

A disposition is the final resolution of a case. Pre-Trial Intervention (PTI) admissions are also included in these statistics. The category 'Transfer to Family' are those contempt cases that were initially identified as indictable, but have been downgraded to disorderly person's domestic violence contempt cases by the Prosecutor's Office in the county of venue. The Family Division has jurisdiction over disorderly person's (DP) contempt actions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-2b. The category 'Transfer to Other' are those cases transferred to another jurisdiction, transferred to the Attorney General or sent to Casino Prosecution.

The number of filings and dispositions are based on the FILING date and DISPOSITION date, respectively, and are independent of one another for the time period listed.

Section Six Municipal Court Domestic Violence Complaints - Filings and Dispositions Statewide Figures

The following tables provide information regarding the number of domestic violence complaints processed by the municipal courts. A complaint, which may include more than one charge, is designated a domestic violence complaint if at least one charge constitutes a domestic violence offense under N.J.S.A. 2C:25-19a.

For the present analysis, a 'filed' domestic violence complaint is one that falls within the initial jurisdiction of the municipal court. This includes most domestic violence related disorderly persons and petty disorderly persons offenses. Domestic violence complaints that include indictable and other charges that statutorily fall within the jurisdiction of the Superior Court, even if filed in municipal court, are not counted. Those filings are properly reflected in the criminal section of this report.

The disposition information includes all domestic violence complaints adjudicated by a municipal court. This includes all cases falling within the initial jurisdiction of a municipal court as well as cases downgraded and remanded back to municipal court by the County Prosecutor.

The number of filings and dispositions are based on the FILING date and DISPOSITION date, respectively, and are independent of one another for the time period listed.
