As representatives of the New Jersey Red Umbrella Alliance, Best Practices Policy Project and residents of the state of New Jersey we write in support of the action to eliminate the publication requirement for name changes as per the recommendation of the Supreme Court CivilPractice Committee and Supreme Court Family Practice Committee. The committee has recommended eliminating the publication requirements set forth in Rule 4:72-3 ("Notice of Application") and 4:72-4 ("Hearing; Judgment; Publication; Filing.")

New Jersey Red Umbrella Alliance (NJRUA) is a group promoting the human rights of sex workers in NJ. The Best Practices Policy Project is organization supporting grassroots advocacy so that collectively we can promote the rights of people who engage in sex work in of all forms.

As we provide support to, and in the case of NJRUA are led by, gender non-conforming and transgender people we have long observed that the requirement for anyone getting a name change to publish this fact in a newspaper is antiquated, expensive and exposes transgner people to potential violence. We note that cisgendered people do not have to follow Rule 4:72-3 ("Notice of Application") and 4:72-4 ("Hearing; Judgment; Publication; Filing this when divorcing and changing their name.

The change proposed with would remove one of the many barriers for transgender people seeking name changes.
