Further, we ask that the Order reflect that the attorneys shall be permitted to ask follow up questions to the prospective jurors at their discretion.

Additionally, our Firm has researched the actions taken during previous pandemics. Our research has revealed that during the 1918 Pandemic some Courts held hearings outdoors to allow for social distancing and ventilation. We feel that this process should be explored for the Spring, Summer, and early Fall Seasons.
